In our country we take for granted our accessibility to education – indeed there is a very high expectation for everyone that they will at least complete high school. In our highly literate society we think nothing of accomplishing the simple task of being able to write our name. But for someone who never had the privilege of receiving a basic education; for someone who has endured the humiliation of only being able to record their name as an "X", the profound joy of being able to properly identify oneself is exceptional.

First Graduates of Alpha Adult Literacy Program

This past summer, important ceremonies were held to recognize the 111 adults who completed literacy classes in Haiti, through the Rayjon-supported Alpha Adult Literacy Program. We are pleased to report that 92% of the candidates successfully passed their final exams. Of special note, are the 50 students (44 women, 6 men) who completed the first ever Level III set of classes. Level III is the final stage in the three-year program, representing the equivalent of a Grade 6 literacy level. We are so proud of these graduates.

In St Marc, the ceremony began with the graduates parading down the main street accompanied by a marching band. A few students provided testimonials, which included heartfelt words of appreciation to the program, its manager, and to Rayjon. And in St. Marc they sang! They sang a welcome song to all those in attendance and they sang their literacy program anthem - a song about the indignity of having to sign your name with an X. Here is an excerpt:

Kreyole: « Ala derespektan, ala manke dega, o ala radiyès pou mwen siyen fòk mwen fè yon kwa, **English**: "How horrible, how insulting, oh, so afraid to sign my name that I must make an X.

The students' success is a testament to their courage and commitment, and it was made possible by people who dreamed of making a difference along with their faithful network of supporters.

WHY RAISE FUNDS FOR EDUCATION IN HAITI?

Education is key to ending poverty.

If all students in low income countries left school with basic reading skills, 171 million people could be lifted out of poverty, which would be equivalent to a 12% cut in world poverty.

In the rural area of Haut de St. Marc, Haiti, two elementary schools in the mountains provide quality education from preschool to grade 7, with a total enrollment of over 450 kids per year. The schools are literally bursting at the seams.

In this remote, mountainous area, few children stay in school beyond elementary school. Secondary school begins at grade 7, but the closest high school is in the city – much too far away and much too expensive for most families. In 2016, with the support of generous donors in Canada, Rayjon was pleased to add grade 7 at both of our rural schools. Parents are anxious



for their children to have the opportunity to attend grade 8 and 9, which we hope to add over the next two years.

THE COST OF EDUCATION:

To support the function of two rural schools (including teachers' salaries, building upkeep, textbooks and curriculum development) Rayjon needs to raise approximately \$11,500 CDN each year. That's just \$23 per pupil!

*To offer the next two levels of secondary school (grades 8 & 9), we need to raise an additional \$6,000 per year.
